


DB impact

- √ 4,761,000 web site visits in 2015 (from 29,000 in 2003)


Doing Business has recorded 2,499 reforms since DB 2006














Data collection




Good Practice

- Efficient & affordable fertilizer product registration.
- Official catalog accessible online.
- Private companies allowed to import.
- Import permit without time limitation.
- Import permit affordable.
- Labeling of fertilizer required.
- Sale of mislabeled fertilizers prohibited.



Fertilizer indicators

Fertilizer EBA16 findings

Asia findings

South Asia and East Asia Pacific have lower overall scores, registration scores and import requirement scores than the average.

On average it takes longer to register fertilizer in Asia than in other regions.

East Asia Pacific has higher quality control scores than the average.

Scores within Asia vary across countries, with above and below average performers.
